COMMUNITY COUNSELING

Did you know? Outreach counselors are available to **Bethel Park residents** at either the Bethel Park Municipal Building or our home office in Mt. Lebanon. Fees for a set number of counseling sessions are generously covered by an annual contract between Outreach and Bethel Park municipality. We also provide presentations for teachers and parents through an annual contract with the Bethel Park School District.

We have also recently launched a **new partnership with SHIM (South Hills Interfaith Movement)** to provide individual counseling services and mental health program for students who participate in after-school programming at the Baldwin SHIM center.

PROGRAM UPDATES

We are offering **QPR** (Question - Persuade - Refer) training for anyone who regularly interacts with youth and is in a position to recognize & refer someone at risk of suicide. This training educates people on how to recognize the early signs of a suicide crisis and to know how and where to find help.

RAAPS is a 21-question youth-risk screening tool that provides resources to improve students' mental health & overall well-being. Assessments can be completed in 5 minutes at your child's school. The results offer interventions, as well as education, resources and referrals for identified at-risk students.
