CAN WE COUNT ON YOU?



Brock* was off the charts gifted and intensely artistic, but he didn't engage with his classes or peers. Instead, he was always searching to attract the 'right' attention from adults he looked up to and hoped would champion him. When these efforts failed time and time again, he became discouraged and began smoking, skipping school, and turning to drugs to mask his pain of inadequacy and not belonging.

During an afternoon spent smoking at Mt. Lebanon Park, a counselor from Outreach approached Brock and sat down to listen to him. It was the first time in his life that Brock had encountered an adult who had a genuine interest in what he was experiencing. This counselor began to regularly make time to show up and talk with Brock, without judgement, and over time, built trust with him as he struggled with mental health issues. Eventually, the counselor encouraged him to visit Outreach's office in Uptown Mt. Lebanon. It was there that the real work on Brock's mental health journey began.

At Outreach, Brock found real support for the challenges he faced. He had a difficult home life, complete with disinterested parents and complicated sibling relationships. But as he grew more comfortable, Brock was able to share his issues during group counseling sessions. He began to understand that his drug use was masking the emotional and psychological stressors caused by his dysfunctional family. His counselor encouraged him to explore this emotions and issues, working together to create new coping skills and healthy habits.

Brock went on to graduate from high school and eventually attended a 4-year college. There were bumps along the road of course, but he always made great strides to return to the coping skills he learned years earlier from a caring, nonjudgmental adult at Outreach.

The year Brock came to Outreach was 1974, but he could just as well be a student in 2023. These critical connections between counselor and client have been occurring every day at Outreach for the past 50 years. We provide a safe space for support, guidance and counseling to children, teen and families, whether they are navigating anxiety, depression, stress, bullying, family discord or difficult transitions, all of which had a place in 1974, but have only become more prevalent today in our complicated society.

At Outreach, we provide affordable and accessible connection, education, counseling, and coaching to children, teens and families through safe, caring, responsive, confidential professional therapists supported by dedicated community advocates.

PROGRAM UPDATES

Outreach counselor Colleen O'Shea will be hosting the first session of our new drug & alcohol group counseling program, **Project TND**, in January 2024. It is designed to help young people ages 14-19 stop or reduce their use of cigarettes, vaping, alcohol, marijuana and hard drugs, along with violence-related behaviors. Participants will better understand what is creating their need to rely on substances so they can work toward making improved choices in the future by developing better decision-making skills. We will also be offering **Mental Health 101** training in the new year! This is for anyone who is interested in learning more about mental health so they can better advocate for others who could benefit from mental health support. The training will educate individuals on how to recognize the early signs of common mental health diagnoses and to know how and where to find help. Groups of 10-20 people can register for a 1-hour session. Outreach will bring the training to you!
